I cannot believe I am writing the June Voice article. The end of April is coming soon and the article is due in early May. FROM THE VICAR

Christ is Risen, Alleluia!

Celebrating the resurrection of our Lord at Good Shepherd this year was a wonderful experience, but I must say, an extremely busy week.

Making visits to our shut-in members, wrapping up First Holy Communion classes, gathering a group of youth and volunteering at St. Luke's Lutheran Church Soup Kitchen (my NYC home congregation that serves an estimated 150 to 300 meals every Tuesday and Thursday, and located in the heart of Times Square), preparation for the Walk with Jesus on Good Friday, and seven services in four days. What a week! What a month!

As I reflect and think about everything that took place during our Lenten Journey and Holy Week, I consider myself to be a fortunate intern to have been placed in such a wonderful congregation. It was truly a blessing to see how many individuals share their time and talents, not only during one of the busiest times on our church calendar, but also throughout the year. I want to thank each of you sincerely for all you do in the name of Jesus.

I would like to share one of the highlights that took place during Holy Week during the youth group urban soup kitchen visit to St. Luke's. On Tuesday, April 19th, nine youth and three adults made our way to the city early in the morning to get a tour of Hell's Kitchen and were able to see the apartment in which I was raised. My mother opens the door to her home, greeting each of us with a cup of orange juice, coffee, or water, and a tour of the apartment. This experience enabled our youth group to learn more about their vicar (yours truly) and see the difference between living in an apartment as opposed to living in a house. Following the apartment visit, we went for a short walk along Times Square, beginning on 47th and ending on 42nd Street. We had a quick fast food lunch and then made our way to an unexpected treat, standing 54 stories high overlooking the island of Manhattan from the roof of the Condé Nast Building on 42nd Street. What a spectacular view of the city: North, South, East and West. We especially thanked my good friend, Daniel Torres, who afforded us this unforgettable experience. After a busy morning, we finally made it to St. Luke's and geared up with our net caps, aprons and gloves to serve on the food line. What an experience each of our youth had dealing with all kinds of ethnicities and walks of life, from the homeless person on the street to the business man with the two-piece suit, each looking for a warm meal to sustain them for the day. Each of our youth interacted with every individual, extending a hand with food to feed someone less fortunate. I must confess to you, I was extremely proud of our young people and the great job each one did, from signing in each person as the clients lined up for food, to serving and cleaning up after everyone had eaten and gone on with the rest of their day. What an experience our group had, with each of us that day sharing the love of Christ, the resurrected Christ, with complete strangers.

To conclude our trip, the youth had an option of either visiting St. Patrick's Cathedral or whatever they wanted to do. They decided unanimously to visit the M&M store, which we did, and save the Cathedral visit for our next trip into the city.

What a memorable experience to have during Holy Week, especially with all the hard work and dedication each of us shares with Good Shepherd. We are one church—one body of Christ—and we share the unconditional love of Christ even with the total stranger.
