FROM THE PASTOR

In the Creed, the church confesses the "resurrection of the body". At Christmas, God took on human life in the person of Jesus of Nazareth. He lived his life as other people lived; yet, he lived among us as fully God. That God came and took on our human flesh says something truly wonderful about our lives here and now.

Throughout history, many religions have sought different escapes from living in the "here and now". Throughout history, Christianity has had its own share of theological "escape buttons". Jesus did seek time for renewal and strength apart from the disciples and the crowds that followed him, but his reason for coming into the world was not to escape from this human life. He came into it fully for the sake of the whole world, even to giving his life on the cross.

To this end, the New Testament texts related to Jesus' presence among the disciples are woven with images of the Risen Christ present among the disciples in body. His risen presence is not imaged as being a physical presence but a bodily presence. Jesus is imaged as walking and talking with the disciples. He eats with the disciples. He shows them his healed wounds as reminders of his suffering and death.

All of this affirms that our lives, our bodies, our world are all precious to God, precious enough for God to redeem the world through the body of Jesus.

Now, as we move from the celebration of the Great Fifty Days of Easter to the celebration of Pentecost in June, the Spirit comes to recommit us to living and being redeemed in, with and through the realities of our present life. Surely, this is not to the exclusion of our hope of heaven and certainly not to the exclusion of faithful living here and now. As we live out the faith here and now, we are the body of Christ in the world today, nourished by the body and blood of Christ offered to us in the Word, shared around the baptismal bath and the Lord's Table.

Living as Christians in the world, we will not agree on what forms of action are required for a faithful service. What is clear, though, is that nothing is "taken off the table" as God calls us to work for what is best for all, while showing unconditional love for those in need. Such a faith never escapes the world. Because it never escapes the world, it takes on worldly issues and concerns with intention, thought and action. Social concerns, then, are concerns of the church.

To this end, there is a theological or faith reason for the church to be a place wherein people discuss, disagree and decide on appropriate action for the sake of the world. Most recently, we have witnessed the horror that the people of Japan are experiencing and will experience for time to come. Our church stands with the people of Japan and has reached out, along with so many others around the world, to help those so desperately in need.

Now, however, we have to consider for ourselves the role of nuclear power in our own area, one of the most densely populated in the world. The issue is not just one of how terrorists might use such a plant for the purpose of mass destruction, but the effect of earthquake and the question of storage of rods. While the corporate world takes such matters into consideration in their planning, corporations exist for the purpose of profit. Profit has been known to put blinders on people, those inside and out of the corporate world. Christians, living out the resurrection, while living in the present, are called to see beyond it and to forge alliances with believers and non, for the sake of the world into which Jesus was born and in which the risen Christ lives today.

You probably have not thought about that tiny phrase in the creed, "I believe in the resurrection of the body." It is filled with historical, Biblical and faith content, and it continues to be a cornerstone for the church's place and mission in the world today.


