## FROM THE PASTOR

I remember being quite surprised by a question from someone who lived in the area of the church. The question was a simple one: Are Lutherans a part of a sectarian church? Wow, that question more than surprised me. It stunned me, but I quickly learned why the person asked it. The name of our church includes the name of a person. Without knowledge of our teachings, I suppose it would be easy for someone to think that Lutherans are sectarians.

I assured this person that Lutherans are part of the "one, holy, catholic and apostolic church", and a vast majority of Lutherans around the world are part of the ecumenical church of Jesus Christ. Granted, there are some Lutherans who have a more narrow view of Christianity than others, but all Lutherans teach that the church is one, holy, catholic and apostolic.

Our Good Shepherd congregation is a good example of how we reflect the wide spectrum of Christianity. We include Roman Catholics, Methodists, Presbyterians, and people from the Reformed denominations, Southern Baptists, Episcopalians and a host of other denominations. We also include people from other Lutheran denominations, just as other congregations include Lutherans.

October 31 is Reformation Day, the day when Luther nailed the 95 Theses to the church door in Wittenberg with the hope of discussing needed reforms in the church. His opponents eventually began to call Luther's supporters "Lutherans", a name included in the official name of some Lutheran churches around the world, but certainly not all. In some countries, the name of the church simply uses the word, "Evangelical" without the using Lutheran. In other countries, the name is The Church of the Augsburg Confession. I don't think that one would work too well here in the USA.

Regardless of the name, Lutherans do not "follow" Martin Luther. Luther's entire teaching is centered in the gospel of Jesus Christ, crucified and resurrected, in the goodness of God's created order in nature and in the world, and in God's anger against sin but love for the sinner. Lutherans believe that the church, rooted in the faith of the apostles, is formed by the Holy Spirit through the proclamation of the Word and the right administration of the sacraments, in grace that is a gift, received by faith alone, created by the Spirit, apart from any human effort.

Many Lutherans do hold a fondness for the Martin Luther they have come to know through his writings. His writings show that Luther was an "earthy" character and a person who had many of his own struggles in life; however, the Holy Spirit was able to use Luther to rekindle the message of scripture in the church again, simply stated in Romans 3:28, that a person is put right with God through faith alone and is saved by grace, apart from doing any good works and that from this gift of faith good works flow freely.

Luther's whole message pointed to Christ and would probably have had a good laugh over the notion that he would be the center of a sectarian religion. The important question today is not about Luther or even the name of a church but how is the Holy Spirit creating passionate, open-minded communities of faith that are driven by Christ's love for the world?

### **GUIDO VON AUTENRIED—HONORED RECIPIENT OF FULLER AWARD**

Guido von Autenried, PE, has been honored as this year's recipient of the "Fuller Award" in the engineering field of water supply. Guido is Director and Chief Engineer of the Consulting Firm: Buck, Seifert & Jost, Inc. in Norwood, New Jersey, a firm for which he has worked for 57 years.

This award, presented by the American Water Works Association (AWWA) is granted to one engineer in each State each year for distinguished service to the water supply field. It is emphasized that this award was initiated by George Warren Fuller, who is credited for his leadership in developing and organizing good water supply practices throughout the USA in the early 1900s.

The award was presented to Guido at the New Jersey AWWA in Atlantic City, New Jersey in March 2011 and at the National Convention of AWWA in Washington, D. C. in June, 2011.

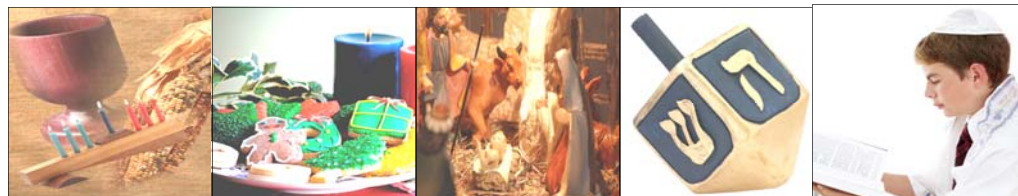

## GREETINGS FROM SUNDAY CHURCH SCHOOL!

Good Shepherd Sunday Church School is off to a great start with our first class having taken place on September 11<sup>th</sup>. The day began with a welcome-back staff breakfast followed by teachers being at the registration tables to meet and greet new students. Once everyone was signed in, we moved on to our weekly mini-service under the leadership of Deanna Lauer.

Each week, students should arrive to Fellowship Hall no later than 10:20 a.m. Students should proceed to their seats and quietly wait for the service to begin promptly at 10:30 a.m. At the conclusion of the mini-service, 3<sup>rd</sup> grade through 5<sup>th</sup> grade will be dismissed with their teachers to their classrooms. Pre-k through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade stay in Fellowship Hall for cherub choir rehearsal under the guidance of Cherub Choir Director Michelle Zaro.
