FROM THE PASTOR

September is "Christian Education" month, but I prefer to think of it as a kickoff time for "Life-long Learning".

Returning from our vacations and time away, we resume all the learning activities that we know at GSPR. We are deeply grateful for the ministries of Creative Play pre-school, our Sunday Church School, our English as Second Language ministry, our weekly Bible Study and past seasonal Bible study groups such as the very successful Divine Drama held a number of years ago, led by Pastor Carol Westphal, and the ongoing faith nurture groups, including WELCA, Confirmation Ministry, our fall youth retreat, and the Working Women's group, the Men's Group and a host of other groups and retreats that cut across generational lines and are held throughout the year.

In the wider community, we have worked with our other religious groups to offer a learning opportunity for people who want to, either find new employment or find work in today's challenging environment. We even started a group for pastors, who help each other grow in faith while helping their respective congregations grow in outreach.

Most recently, we concluded one of the best Vacation Church School programs ever. The numbers of participants was the highest in fifteen years, and we had more volunteers than we needed, although a place was found for everyone who wanted to participate. We are hoping to share this experience with you through a special, high definition video that will be a "streaming event" as part of a future sermon.

In addition, many of us remember the "Communiversities" held at Good Shepherd where, on each Wednesday night, three courses were taught by members who shared particular interests and passions that have helped them and others in their faith journey. The turnout for these courses was nothing short of fantastic.

Even our participation in the seminary internship program is a learning event of our congregation for student and congregation alike. The possibilities in the church for learning are exciting and endless.

Indeed, life-long learning cuts through all our missions and ministries. Consider how much our young people learn about the message of the Bible as they come together and perform the musicals they have so adroitly and artistically performed. Who would have thought that we have so much talent in our church family through which so much learning has taken place for young and old alike?

Plans are underway to gather those passionate about the visual arts with the hope that the church can be a place where artists of all faiths or no faith, can come together, share experiences and help the wider community grow in its appreciation of the visual arts. Throughout history, the church has always been a community that supported the arts, and we look forward to carrying on this tradition with our artists here at Good Shepherd and in our wider community. There is a lot to learn. Certainly, my own continuing education programs over the past year have focused on the visual arts because I wanted to learn more about this gift in life. In addition to these experiences of life-long learning, Hospice of Rockland will be holding an education event for our congregation and wider community in November. Make sure you look for the information provided in next month's newsletter.

To help us plan for the future, this August, a new group convened with the purpose of helping us identify ways to provide even more opportunities for life-long learning in the faith. At our first meeting, each person shared one experience they had in learning that changed their lives in a lasting and meaningful way. What a pleasure it was to hear of these experiences. Those in attendance left with a sense of blessing just being together and sharing. It is true that some of our best learning takes place in the "learn through pain" school, but learning can also be fun, invigorating and challenging. The church is especially effective when it serves as a place wherein people can share and learn with others.

To this end, we are looking to making every month a life-long learning month at Good Shepherd church. We have so much to learn and so much to share. We are grounded by grace in God's plan of salvation for the whole world. As we come to observe and learn, we come to know the eternal grace of our God in Jesus Christ.
